

PWCCP Criteria for Specialty BREED JUDGES for inclusion on the ballot:

1. Suggested judges with the most nominations should be given first consideration.
2. Must not be a member of the PWCCP.
3. Must be licensed/approved by AKC to judge Pembrokes or in the case of a foreign judge, must be licensed in their own country and therefore approvable by AKC.
4. Must have been involved with Pembrokes for at least 5 years in at least one of the following capacities:
 - a. as a breeder or co-breeder of at least 2 litters of Pembrokes finishing at least 2 champions (not necessarily AKC, could be from another country)
 - b. as an owner or co-owner who has owned Pembrokes for at least 5 years, finishing at least 2 champions (not necessarily AKC, could be from another country)
 - c. as a retired professional handler who has shown at least 2 Pembrokes to their championship.
5. Preference given to those who are members in good standing of an all-breed or specialty club.
6. Preference given to those who have not judged our specialty within the 5 years prior to the PWCCP specialty assignment.
7. Must not have accepted another identical Pembroke assignment in the United States within one year prior to the PWCCP specialty assignment.
8. Preference given to those who have not judged another regional specialty or national specialty within 2 years of the PWCCP specialty assignment.
9. Special circumstances may apply which are not covered above; in those cases the committee may apply special consideration with board approval.

PWCCP Criteria for Specialty SWEEPSTAKES JUDGES inclusion on the ballot:

1. Suggested judges with the most nominations should be given first consideration.
2. Must not be a PWCCP member.
3. Preference given to those who have demonstrated involvement in Pembroke Welsh Corgis, either by breeding at least 2 champions, by having owned at least 2 champions or by finishing 2 champions as a professional.
4. Must have at least one judging experience, either at a match, supported entry sweepstakes, specialty sweepstakes, or similar if from another country.
5. Preference given to those who are members in good standing of an all-breed or specialty club
6. Preference given to those who have not judged our specialty within the 5 years prior to the PWCCP specialty assignment.
7. Must not have accepted another identical Pembroke assignment in the United States within a year of the PWCCP specialty assignment.
8. Preference given to those who have not judged another regional specialty or national specialty within 2 years of the PWCCP specialty assignment.
9. Special circumstances may apply which are not covered above; in those cases the committee may apply special consideration with board approval.

PWCCP Criteria of MATCH JUDGES for inclusion on the ballot:

1. Suggested judges with the most nominations should be given first consideration.
2. Current Judges Selection Committee members are not to be considered.
3. Must have demonstrated involvement in Pembroke Welsh Corgis, either by breeding at least one champion or by having owned at least one champion or by finishing at least one champion as a professional.
4. Preference given to those who will not have judged our specialty or our match within the past 4 years prior to the PWCCP match assignment.
5. Preference given to those who have not judged a PWCCP supported entry sweepstakes within a year prior to the PWCCP match assignment.
6. Special circumstances may apply which are not covered above; in those cases the committee may apply special consideration with board approval.

PWCCP Criteria of Specialty JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP JUDGES:

1. Suggested AKC approved judges with the most nominations should be given first consideration.
2. Must not have judged for the PWCCP specialty within 3 year prior to the PWCCP specialty assignment.

PWCCP Criteria of Specialty OBEDIENCE & RALLY JUDGES:

1. Suggested judges with the most nominations should be given first consideration.
2. Preference given to those judges AKC approved to judge Obedience thru Utility and Rally
3. Preference given to those who have not judged our Specialty within 3 years.
4. Special circumstances may apply which are not covered above; in those cases the committee may apply special consideration with board approval.

Collection of judge information:

The Judges Selection Committee will use the PWCCA information on Regional Club Judging Assignments and the AKC Judges Directory as an aid in evaluating whether a judge qualifies according to the stated criteria. Once the list of suggested judges has been narrowed down according to information that is known, a letter (preferably by email) will be sent to each judge that the Judges Selection Committee is intending to include their name on the ballot. The letter will ask the judge to read thru the list of requirements, sign and return the letter at the bottom next to the sentence that applies to them.

Ballot:

1. The ballot will include the following information on each nominee:
Judge Name
Kennel Name
Location
2. All Nominees will be listed in alphabetical order.
3. Categories and timeline will follow the PWCCP Procedure For Judges Selection

Ballot Tabulation for Domestic and Foreign Breed Judges :

A report and ballot results are sent to the PWCCP Board. Our President or Board member will contact the judges. The first place judge for breed classes has their choice of Dogs & Intersex or Bitches. The 2nd place judge is offered the remainder of the assignment. The runner's up and other rankings are kept for use should a contacted judge decline. No results from the tabulation are disclosed to the membership until the judges have been contacted and have accepted the assignment. The only results from the tabulation that are ever shared with the general membership are the judges who were selected and have verbally or formally accepted the assignment.

Some years the PWCCP board will decide to use 2 breed class judges, some years 1 breed class judge. In the case of using 2 breed judges; the 2 judges with the most votes will be contacted. Assignments will be offered as stated above.

1. If the judge with the most votes is a foreign judge, the domestic judge with the most votes will be used as the 2nd judge.
2. If the judge with the most votes is a domestic judge, then the judge with the 2nd most votes will be used regardless of homeland. (2nd judge may be foreign or domestic)
3. If the two judges with the most votes are both domestic, they will be offered the assignments as stated above, and that year no foreign judge will be used.
4. For budget reasons, the PWCCP will not use 2 foreign judges. In the rare instance that there are no votes for a domestic judge, a 2nd ballot may be necessary.
5. In the case of a year where we are using 1 breed judge, the judge with the most votes will be offered the assignment.
